Akshara Foundation facilitated Maths Contests
for children in grades 4 to 6 across

361 Gram Panchayats in the districts

of Dhenkanal, Ganjam and Mayurbhanj. The initiative engaged

more than 54,000 children from over

2,400 schools and aimed at understanding the learning levels of children in maths, through a community-driven approach.



# What is a Gram Panchayat Maths Contest?



The Gram Panchayat Maths Contest, a pioneering initiative in India, serves as a community-driven endeavour to assess the quality of maths education. These Contests, independently organised by local communities, have proven effective in sparking conversations among parents, teachers, and community members.

Except for the question paper, which we at Akshara Foundation print, these Contests are organised entirely by the community members. On the chosen day, children in grades 4, 5 and 6 turn up at the contest venues, usually at the GP headquarters or school forecourts. They sit in neat, disciplined rows, under a colourful shamiana, and await their maths test.







The timer is set to 1 hour as they begin the test. Village Education Volunteers evaluate the answer sheets soon after the hour is over, before finally announcing the winners. The volunteers are local village youth who are educated and willing to give time and effort to helping their community without any monetary reward, and are identified, selected and trained by Akshara's field coordinators.

The concept of Gram Panchayat Maths Contests has opened up many a healthy dialogue between stakeholders like parents, teachers and other community members regarding their children's learning levels.





### Distinctive Features

#### Of a Gram Panchayat Maths Contest



- Transparency at the Core: The Contests adopt a transparent approach, providing a fun setting for assessing children's maths skills.
- Local Involvement: Entirely managed by trained Education Volunteers and GP Team Leaders within each Gram Panchayat.
- Objective Evaluation: Observers, including teachers and parents, can witness the Contests but are not permitted to intervene during the process.
- Swift Recognition: Winners are promptly announced, and prizes distributed within three hours, enhancing the excitement and impact of the initiative.

- Community-driven Funding:
  Entirely funded by local communities, showcasing a collective commitment to education.
- Reward System: Acknowledging academic excellence, the top nine scorers in each Contest receive prize money and certificates.
- Impressive Participation: The Contests achieved large attendance.

## Methodological Insights



- The question papers were printed by Akshara and shipped to the GP locations just-in-time
- **Grade-Appropriate Assessment:** Children from grades 4 to 6 were evaluated based on the competencies of the preceding grade.
- Local Expertise: Answer sheets were meticulously graded by dedicated Education Volunteers using an answer key provided by Akshara Foundation.







# Case Study But We Did It



The sea change this year for GP Contests was collaboration. The School and Mass Education (S&ME) Department, never known for half-measures or shying away from ambitious projects, had one condition. "We will do the Contests in all the GPs of the district this time." "Mayurbhanj has 188 GPs," says District Field Manager Manoj Kumar Panda.

The Department's deadline too was uncompromising: "Cover all the GPs in one week in December 2023." It was rushed and hectic and incessant. Those who were in charge of the Contests craved for time - the GPs, the team, the Education Volunteers, Department officials - and time went bustling by in a blink. "But we did it," says Manoj. They overshot their timeline only by five days. "We proved we could do it."





At the heart of it was a calm, measured approach, and for a first-time event, every detail was entrusted and allocated, and activity spread across the GPs of the district like it was preordained. For the team, the Nahandasol GP Contest in Betanati block was an exceptional experience. Out-of-the-ordinary because of the joint orchestration by two highly individualistic, warm-hearted officials, the GP Sarpanch Govinda Hansdha, and Kanan Bala Kar, the Headmistress (HM) of the Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya (KGBV) where the Contest was held.

The KGBV students embodied hospitality as they welcomed officials and their peers from the five neighbouring schools taking part with respect, friendship, and warmth. Govinda Hansdha's interest in education took the Contest up another level. Sharing the spotlight with him that day was the KGBV HM, young, at 36, vibrant, compassionate, and a doer.

Kanan Bala Kar takes KGBV's lofty vision to heart and stamps on it her innate idealism. She's been in the profession for 23 years and there's little she doesn't know about the young girls and boys in her school. She has 213 students at KGBV, more girls than boys. "Most of them are seeing a school for the first time," she says.

"Maths is a problem," Kanan Bala Kar concedes. For two years now, Ganitha Kalika Andolana (GKA), Akshara's Maths Programme, has been implemented in her school, its kit a rich and enlightening resource. "My students have improved a lot," Kanan Bala Kar begins. Then emphatically, "Fear has gone. The fear of maths. Even my weak students have found a way to learn with the kit."



# Case Study But We Did It




The most represented school at the Nahandasol GP Contest was KGBV – 100 of the 154 participants were from Kanan Bala Kar's school. "We prepared them thoroughly. We motivated them. We told them they would be prizewinners. And they wrote their test fearlessly and with abandon. Our children have no fear," declares Kanan Bala Kar proudly. Six of the nine prizewinners at the Contest were KGBV students.

For now, though, Kanan Bala Kar is an overjoyed HM, basking in the celebrity of her star performers. "I love my students very much. I try hard to empower them, to grow and develop their inner qualities. They all have it in them. These children are my life." She can't say enough about their self-assertion, their dauntlessness, and the triumph they seized on the day of the Contest. She believes that ultimately, it's not their circumstances, their penury, or their lack that will underscore their personality. It's the facilities and opportunities, the nurturing, grooming and coaching that schools like KGBV provide that will be life-defining.












